- a. Supporting coaches through team issues:
 - Listening to coaches
 - Establish rules that are consistent for all players
 - NFHS Learn video for parents is helpful
 - NFHS Learn Sportsmanship video used for ejected players / parents
 - reminding them of their value,
 - observing the practices,
 - team meetings and parent meetings,
 - meeting with kid, coach and parents; Get players/parents to talk directly with coach is very helpful. Player must be present at meeting when meeting with parent.
 - Coach do self evaluation, share student evals
 - Do not answer the phone unless you know who it is, and maybe not then. Let it go to voicemail If it is important they will leave a message.

b. Ideas to retain coaches/find coaches

- Are schools offering too many sports? Are they creating a good experience for students when we can't find quality people. Then kids feel that their sport/team isn't cared about. Do not offer sports that do not come from student interest.
- Big change over the years...more teachers coached in the past; more off campus coaches than on campus coaches.
- ADs talk with administrators about hiring teachers with coaching experience and/or interest. Talk with principals about hiring teachers that coach in interview process, ask what else are you going to get involved in on campus?
- Posting coaching jobs Indeed.com and <u>ihire.com</u>
- Some schools have age requirements (21 and older), 3 graduations out from their high school graduation,
- Truly support your good off campus coaches as you will want them to come back; for example, allow coaches to use facility for little or no charge, be available to coaches as much as possible
- It is a problem at all schools to find coaches.

- c. Overfelt wrestling tournament issue Meghan Levers
 - Some kids, coaches and parents complained of burning eyes and lungs after the JV Wrestling tournament at Overfelt. EMS, fire, and police came to the site. It was found that the overhead lighting was emitted a gaseous chemical that was irritating some people's eyes and lungs. A few people were transported to the hospital for evaluation; Overfelt admin team was able to ventilate the area and make the area safe for the varsity tournament to be held the next day.
